Report on Panel Discussion

The *Debate and Extramural Committee* of Kalimpong College, organised a panel discussion for the students of the college on the 21st of May 2022. The theme for the Panel Discussion was "*Education in the 21st Century*". It had sub-themes for all the three semesters:

2nd semester Online Education is the Future

4th semester Technology in Education: Boon or Curse 6th semester How inclusive is our Education System

The students of the college enthusiastically participated in the discussion. The panel discussion was held in three session; one session for each semester. The faculty members of the college were moderators and judges and the performance of the students was assessed by a panel comprising of three judges in each panel. In each semester, three students were awarded for their performance, based on the assessment of the judges. The best speaker among all the three sessions was also awarded. The academic fraternity enjoyed the programme and vibrant discussion took place in all the three sessions.

In this session, the students deliberated upon the pros and cons of online education and if the future of education would be online. They had divergent views, while some argued that the online mode of education has increased the access to education in the remote areas and more students are able to access quality education through online mode, as it is cost effective; others argued that the poor network in the remote areas, was a hurdle and to access education as one had to rent a room in an urban area to have access to it so the cost effectiveness is reduced as they pay for course fee online, internet charges and rent which combine together is equal to the cost of education in the offline or campus mode.

There were interesting questions raised by the students who were the listeners to this discussion they openly expressed their views and comments on each speaker. For instance one speaker had mentioned one of the cons of online education as its negative effect on the eyes and more lens and spectacles among people. One student countered it and put forward his argument that even Gandhi had spectacles so there is not relation between online education and spectacles/ weak eyesight. There were similar vibrant discussions that took place in this session.

In this session, the use of technology in education was deliberated upon by all the panelist. Some favoured the use of technology in education, while others opposed and preferred the old system of education. In their opinion the old system of education facilitated learning as concentration was

higher, distractions were less and the bond between teacher and student was better as each understood each other and were able to respond to any queries immediately. The teacher could assess who was attentive and following him/her and those who were mentally absent. Those who favoured the use of technology highlighted the ease of access, balancing both work and studies as reasons for favouring the use of technology. As students were just out of the online education their focus was more on use of technology in online classes and they focussed more on that rather than highlighting other aspects of technology.
