### About the College:

India's neighbourhood, especially South Asia and its adjoining regions holds critical importance for its security, economic growth and development and global aspirations. India's neighbourhood relations are mainly guided by some principles such as Panchsheel, Non-Alignment, Non-aggression, Co-operation, Non-Reciprocity, Sovereignty and Non-Interference, Connectivity, Regional Stability and Security, Neighbourhood First, and SAGAR (Security and Growth for All in the Region) and 5s (Samman, Samvad, Shanti, Samriddhi, Sanskriti). India's neighbourhood policy is significantly shifting due to geopolitical shifts, economic integration, and strategic competition, particularly in the Indo-Pacific era.
